Maternity & Neonatal Network: 10 Years On & Going Strong

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What networks are there?

Neonatal network.

Wessex and TV. Funded with policies, data and governance

Maternal medicine network.

TV is one of 16, and the first. Funded but not statutory.

Maternity Network.

AHSN/ HI Oxford & TV part funded. Not statutory. Clinical/ safety branch of the BOB LMNS, largely clinical-only relationship with other LMNSs. Limited governance.

Fetal medicine network.

Awaiting NHSE funding/ mandate. Not funded or statutory so no governance or data. Clinician-based. Policy and education-based.

Where were we in 2014?

- 45% 'born in the right place' rate
- Postcode lottery eg no PTB services exc Oxford and Bucks
- No communication at consultant level between units exc OXSFOG
- Different practice in different units: confusing for registrars and dangerous
- Unclear referral patterns for complex/ rare stuff: last minute referral
- No maternal or fetal medicine networks

Thames Valley) offered
money and support to set up
a maternity network.



How do we work?

- Twice yearly meetings 'steering group'
- ...aligned with MatNeo agenda (which is fortunately wide)
- Representatives from trusts, partic senior midwifery ones, lay rep

 - What is a problem in our area and how do we address it?

Support for OxGRIP universal 36w scan and pathways

Simulation workshops

National lobbying eg steroids and MIS, networks
